



Factsheet - Royal British Legion Industries

Royal British Legion Industries (RBLI) was formed from The Royal British Legion in April 1925 to provide care, rehabilitation, employment and housing for Service and ex - Service personnel.

Based at Aylesford in Kent, within the grounds of Preston Hall, originally a Tudor manor, on a 60 acre site. RBLI provides the following welfare, healthcare and housing services:

- Mountbatten Pavilion - a 24 bedded supported housing scheme for single ex - Servicemen and those returning from the Commonwealth.
- Prince Philip Lodge - a six, two bed - roomed block of self contained flats for those returning from the Commonwealth with stays of up to eight months.
- Family Housing - consists of 78 houses and bungalows for ex - Service families leaving the Armed Forces, who may have a disability.
- Queen Elizabeth Court - an extra care assisted living scheme of forty, one and two bedroomed flats, for ex - Service personnel and their dependants who require a level of home care from the on - site domiciliary care team.
- Gavin Astor House - a fifty bedded nursing home providing high - dependency nursing care for both young and older ex - Service veterans.
- Vocational Assessment Centre - providing an assessment and job - seeking service for Service and ex - Service personnel wishing to gain employment.

RBLI provides a Housing Related Support Service under the Government's Supporting People Service for all its welfare and housing services.
